**Extension of Tax Deadline Filings and Payments** 

The Deadline for Quarterly Estimated Payments Will Remain April 15, 2020

DOR will keep the deadline for quarterly estimated tax payments for 2020 as-is. DOR understands that accuracy is going to be compromised, and if taxpayers are not able to estimate their 2020 tax by preparing a 2019 Oregon return by April 15, 2020, they can utilize safe harbor (100% of the prior year's tax) by using their 2019 estimated tax as the basis for the required installment(s) until more accurate figures are available. DOR also has regular waiver remedies (Oregon Administrative Rule 150-316-0487), which can be applied next tax year on a case-by-case basis.
